New Independent Director

Scout welcomes Ms. Liz Monger to the Board of Directors as an Independent Director. With over 27 years of experience in investor relations, communications, and compliance within the mining sector, Ms. Monger has been a driving force in positioning mineral exploration companies for success. In particular, she is well known in Idaho, having spent 10 years as the Manager of Investor Relations and Corporate Secretary of Midas Gold (now Perpetua Resources). While there, she was the founder of the Idaho Mining Association (IMA) Investor Coalition which, in partnership with the IMA and state government officials, conducted multiple successful investor day events that significantly raised the profile of Idaho as a place for mining and resource investment.

Ms. Monger is presently the co-founder and Partner of NIKLI Communications and is the co-founder of the Vancouver Mining Collective. Her extensive network along with deep understanding of investor relations and corporate governance will be invaluable to Scout moving ahead.

Appointment of Vice Presidents

The Company has appointed Mr. Patrick Donovan to the position of Vice President of Exploration, previously having served as Scout's Principal Geologist. Mr. Donovan brings over 35 years of experience managing exploration, development, and production in western United States gold and copper systems, including a long tenure as Chief Geologist at the tier one-scale Twin Creeks open pit gold mine in northern Nevada. His previous roles include USA Exploration Manager at SSR Mining and Chief Geologist at multiple operations with Newmont across Nevada, where he led major exploration initiatives and resource development programs.

Scout has also appointed Mrs. Amanda Irons to Vice President of Corporate Development, previously having served as Senior Geologist, Director of Business Development at Scout. With over 13 years of experience in the geoscience sector, Mrs. Irons has expertise spanning multiple facets of the minerals industry, including economic geology, geological engineering, marketing, and business development. She holds an M.S. in Mineral Exploration and a B.Sc. in Geological Engineering from the Colorado School of Mines, and previously held positions at Forte Dynamics, EMX Royalty Corp., Gustavson Associates, and numerous government contracts working on Tribal relations. Mrs. Irons is a Certified Professional Geologist and serves as the Qualified Person for Scout's technical disclosures.

Addition of Technical Advisor

Scout also welcomes Dr. Federico Cernuschi as a Technical Advisor of the Company. Dr. Cernuschi is an independent consultant specializing in the geology, geochemistry, and exploration of porphyry copper systems. He has provided consulting support in over 20 countries to numerous companies over the past 15 years, including First Quantum, Rio Tinto, Lundin, and several others. Dr. Cernuschi completed his M.S. and Ph.D. in Economic Geology at Oregon State University under Dr. John Dilles and was the 2024 recipient of the Brian J. Skinner award from the Society of Economic Geologists. Dr. Cernuschi's ability to integrate advanced geochemical techniques with traditional field observations will improve Scout's exploration and targeting capabilities in porphyry copper systems, most importantly at the Cuddy Mountain project.

Scout is fortunate to be adding these skilled personnel to key positions in the Company, at a time when interest in mineral exploration in the United States is accelerating, and Idaho is emerging as a premier jurisdiction for new discoveries.
